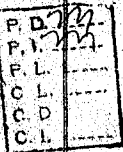

Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know All Men By These Presents:

That we George Bullette and Bettie Bullette
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred no 00 DOLLARS,
The receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged and to be in hand paid by Ed. Chastain

do hereby ~~buy~~ ^{buy} grant, sell and convey unto the said Ed. Chastain
and unto His heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the South East Corner of Lot Five and running North One Hundred & Fifty Feet
Thence west Fifty Feet Thence South One Hundred & Fifty Feet Thence East Fifty Feet to the place
of commencement (The North 50 feet being in Lot 6) according to the official Plat and Government
Survey of City of Tulsa Ind. Ter. and in Block Thirty (30).

To have and to hold the same unto the said Ed. Chastain and unto His heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Ed. Chastain that They
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bettie Bullette wife of the said George Bullette
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Ed. Chastain
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
