## Warranty Deed

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

## Know All Men By These Presents:

That we Chancey A. Owen and Mary Owen  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of \$25.00 DOLLARS,  
to them in hand paid by Mary S. Allison, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged,

do hereby ~~bargain~~ <sup>convey</sup>, grant, sell and convey unto the said Mary S. Allison  
and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: That part of lot 5 in section 2, T19 North, Range 12 East, described as follows:  
Commencing at the southwest corner of Block One in Tulsa, D.T., thence Northerly along the west line of said block  
a distance of 243.7 feet, thence Westerly along the south line of Archer Avenue to a junction with Blwood  
Avenue, continued, thence southerly along the East line of said Blwood Avenue, continued, to a junction  
with W.K. Street, thence easterly to the place of beginning.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Mary S. Allison and unto her heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Mary S. Allison that they  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mary Owen wife of the said Chancey A. Owen  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Mary S. Allison  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
