WAIVER OF OBLIGATION UNDER BOND.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT WHEREAS, on the 30th day of July 1907, the Secretary of the Interior approved an oil and gas mining lease on the allotment of Leah Pond, said allotment embracing SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 4, T. 19 N R. 13 E., said lease being made by Leah Pond to The Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Co., and

WHEREAS, the Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Co. made and executed a bond to the United States of America in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) conditioned upon the said The Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Co. to faithfully performing all the conditions and obligations of the aforesaid lease and observing all laws of the United States and regulations thereafter made by the Secretary of the Interior, and,

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior has been relieved by Act of Congress of May 27, 1908, of all further jurisdiction of said premises and said lease and is desirous of being relieved of any and all obligations and duties under said lease and bond, and

WHEREAS, the said Leah Pond has transferred by mesne conveyance all her right, title and interest to the land covered by the aforesaid lease to J.P. McCarty, The said transfer having been made on the-----day of----- 1909.
