## RELEASE OF MORTGAGE.

COMPARED

For and in consideration of full payment the receipt of which is this day acknowledged W.E. Dunaway hereby releases and discharges a certain mortgage, executed by W.H. Malcolm and Emma Malcolm, his wife, to W.E. Dunaway, for \$3500.00 dated February 12th 1907, and recorded February 21st 1907, in Book 11, at Page 246 of the records of the Ex-officio Recorder for the Western District of the Indian Territory, at Tulsa, I.T. on the following described tract of real estate situated in the town of Tulsa, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the Most Northerly line of Block one Hundred and Five (105) in the Original Town of Tulsa, Fifty (50) feet in a Westerly direction from the Most Northerly corner of said Block, thence in a South Easterly direction and parallel with the Most Easterly line of said Block, a distance of One Hundred and Forty (140) feet; Thence in a South Westerly direction parallel with the Most Northerly line of said Block a distance of fifty (50) feet; thence in a North Westerly direction parallel with the most Easterly line of said Block a distance of One Hundred and forty (140) feet; thence in a Northeasterly direction along the Most Northerly line of said Block, a distance of Fifty (50) feet to the place of beginning. according to the official plat and survey thereof.
