OIL AND GAS MINING LEASE.

Upon Land Selected for Allotment, Creek Nation, Indian Territory.

(Sec. 17 act of June 30, 1902, 32 Stat., 500)

THIS INDENTURE OF LEASE, made and entered into, in quadruplicate on this 14th day of June, A.D. 1906, by and between Monday Durant, Guardian of Edith Durant, born Sept. 2nd, 1899, Boynton, I.T. of Boynton, I.T. party of the first part, and Galbreath Oil and Gas Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the United States in force in the Indian Territory of Tulsa, I.T. party of the second part, under and in pursuance of the provisions of section 17 of the act of Congress approved June 30, 1902, and the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior thereunder.

Witnesseth: That the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the royalties, covenants, stipulations, and conditions hereinafter contained, and hereby agreed to be paid, observed, and performed by the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, does hereby demise, grant, and let unto the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, for the term of 11 years two months and 18 days from date hereof, all of the oil deposits and natural gas in or under the following described tract of land, lying and being within the Creek Nation, and within the Indian Territory, to-wit: The East Half of Northwest Quarter of of Section 15, township 17 north, range 12 east, of the Indian Meridian and containing 80 acres, more or less, with the right to prospect for, extract, pipe, store, refine and remove such oil and natural gas, and to occupy and use so much only of the surface of said land as may be reasonably necessary to carry on the work of prospecting for, extracting, piping, storing refining, and removing such oil and natural gas, including also the right to obtain from wells or other sources on said land, by means of pipe lines or otherwise, a sufficient supply of water to carry on said operations, and including still further the right to use such oil and natural gas as fuel so far as it is necessary to the prosecution of said operations.

In consideration of which the party of the second part hereby agrees and binds itself, its successors and assigns to pay or cause to be paid to the lessor as royalty the sum of ten per cent of the value, on the leased premises, of all crude oil extracted from the said land, and if the parties do not before the thenth day of the month succeeding its extraction, agree upon the value of the crude oil on the leased premises, the value thereof shall finally be determined under the direction of the Secretary of the Interior in such manner as he shall prescribe, and to so pay the royalty accruing for any month on or before the twenty-fifth day of the month succeeding, and where the value of the crude oil fluctuates, the average value during the month shall constitute the criterion in computing the royalty; and to pay in yearly payments, at the end of each year one hundred and fifty dollars royalty on each gas-producing well, the lessor, to
