OIL AND GAS MINING LEASE.

UPON LANDS SELECTED FOR ALLOTMENT CHEROKEE NATION INDIAN TERRITORY.

(Section 72, Act of July 1, 1902, 32 Stat. 716, 726)

THIS INDENTURE, OF LEASE, Made and entered into in quadruplicate on this 28th day of April A.D. 1905, by and between Henry C. Walkley Curator of Jessie West, a minor Born October 31st, 1895 of Claremore, Indian Territory, party of the first part, and Penn Oil Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the United States in force in the Indian Territory, of Bartlesville, Indian Territory, party of the second part, under and in pursuance of the provisions of section 72 of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, and the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior thereunder.

WITNESSETH: That the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the royalties, covenants, stipulations and conditions hereinafter contained and hereby agreed, to be paid, observed and performed by the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, does hereby demise, grant, and let unto the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, for the term of ending October 30th, 1913, years from the date hereof, all of the oil deposits, and natural gas in or under the following described tract of land, lying and being within the Cherokee Indian Nation and within the Indian Territory, to-wit: The West One Half of North West Quarter of Section Twenty six (26) township Twenty one (21) North, range Thirteen (13) East, of the Indian Meridian, and containing Eighty (80) acres, more or less, with the right to prospect for,
