And the said party of the second part expressly agrees that should it or its sublessees, heirs, executors administrators, successors, or assigns, violate any of the covenants, stipulations or provisions of this lease, or fail for the period of sixty days to pay the stipulated monthly royalty provided for herein, when the party of the first part shall be at liberty, in his discretion, to avoid this indenture of lease and cause the same to be annulled, when all the rights, franchises, and privileges of the party of the second part, its sublessees, heirs, executors, administrators, successors, or assigns hereunder shall cease and end without further proceedings.

If the lessee makes reasonable and bona fide effort to find and produce oil in paying quantity as is herein required of it, and such effort is unsuccessful it may at any time thereafter with the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, surrender and wholly terminate this lease upon the full payment and performance of all its then existing obligations hereunder. Provided, however, that approval of such surrender by the Secretary will be required only during the time his approval of the alienation of the land is required by law.

It is further agreed and understood that this lease shall be of no force or effect unless the party of the second part shall, within sixty days from the date of approval of the application filed in connection herewith furnish a satisfactory bond in accordance with the regulations of March 27, 1865, prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior, which shall be deposited and remain on file in the Indian office during the life of this lease.
