That Sampson Emarthloche, was a full blood indina on the Creek Roll at the Union Agency at Muskogee, Oklahoma, and by reason thereof there was allotted to him the following land situate in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to-wit:

The West  $\frac{1}{2}$  and the Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 23, Township 18 North, Range 13 East, and the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 22, Township 18 North, Range 13 East, containing 160 acres more or less.

The Court further finds that the said Sampson Emarthloche departed this life on the 23 day of July 1899, in the Western District, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, in what is now Okfuskee County, State of Oklahoma, intestate, le aving as sole heirs at law Lucinda Lumpkin, petitioner herein, who is a full blood Creek Indian and of full and legal age and Maline Deer, who is a minor (Indian Name Maline Emarthloche).

The Court further finds that the said Sampson Emarthloche, deceased had no issue born to him since the 4th, day of March 1906, and that the petitioner herein and C. Ben Halkey, the regular acting guardian of said minor Maline Deere, did on the 22nd day of September 1908, make and enter into a voluntary patition of the estate of the said Sampson Emarthloche, deceased, pursuant to an order made on the15th, day of September 1908, in Probate No. 275, in the County Court of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, authorizing such partition, and that in said partition the West ½ of the Southwest ½ of Section 23, Township 18 North, Range 13 East, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, hecame the separate property of petitioner herein, and that the petit.oner herein, Lucinda Lumpkins did on the 17 day of June 1909, make, execute and deliver a Warranty Deed, jointly with her husband
