WHEREAS MINNIE TINKER, NEE SPYBUCK, an allottee of the Cherokee Nation, has made application for the removal of restrictions from the following described land, to-wit:

The Southeast Quarter (SE/4) of the Southeast Quarter (SE/4) of Section Fourteen (14) Township Twenty One (21) North, Range Twelve (12) East of the Indian Base and Meridian containing 40 acres more or less, located in Tulsa County.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Under the authority vested in me by the Act of Congress approved May 27, 1908 (Public No. 140) and the regulations prescribed thereunder, hereby remove the restrictions from said above described land without conditions concerning terms of sale and disposal of the proceeds; said removal of restrictions to be effective thirty days from date hereof.

That the Alsuma Townsite Company, a corporation, organized and existing under and by virtue of the Act of Congress of February 18, 1901, providing for the formation of corporations in the Indian Territory, in consideration of Fifty (50.00) Dollars cash in hand paid to it by Miss Eva Owenby, of New Port, Washington, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Eva Owenby all the following described parcel of land situate in the town of Alsuma, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, according to survey and plat of ^{town} ~~town~~ embraced in the land described as the East Half of the Southwest Quarter and Lot Three (3) of Section Thirty (30), Township Nineteen (19) Range Fourteen 14, East, according to the United States Survey, said parcel of land being known and designated upon the plat thereof as:

Lot number Two (2), Block Number Twelve (12); Lot Number Three (3) Block Number Twelve (12). Together with all the improvements thereon and the appurtenances thereunto belonging, and warrants the title to the same.
