IN THE COUNTY COURT OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA.

IN THE MATTER OF THE ALIENATION OF THE HOMESTEAD ALLOTMENT SUNDAY GRAYSON, DECEASED.

ORDER.

Now, on this the 28th, day of June, 1909, this matter came on for hearing upon the petition of Buck Grayson, as an heir at law of Sunday Grayson, deceased, praying for an order of this court approving a certain deed of conveyance, by him executed, conveying all his right, title and interest in and to the homestead allotment of Sunday Grayson, deceased.

Said petitioner appearing in person and by his attorneys, Abbott and Brown, and the Court after hearing the evidence of the petitioner, and other testimony, and being fully advised in the premises, finds:

That the allegations in the petiton contained are true; that the petitioner Buck Grayson, is a full blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such; that Sunday Grayson, deceased, was a full blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such, and that there was allotted to him with other lands, as his homestead, of the lands of the Creek Nation, the following described land, satuated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to-wit:

The Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 4, Township 19 North, Range 13 East.

That the said Sunday Grayson deceased, died on or about the ____day of May 1900; in and while a resident of what is now Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that the said Sunday Grayson deceased, died leaving surviving him, as his only heirs at law, this petitioner Buck Grayson, his Brother and Susie Harjo, nee grayson and Jennie grayson, sisters, and Wattie Grayson and Dick Grayson, brothers of the said Sunday Grayson, deceased, and that the said Sunday Grayson, deceased, had no children born to him after the 4th, day of March 1906.

The Court further finds that on the 28th, day of June 1909, the petitioner Buck grayson, made, executed and delivered a deed of conveyance to one R. A. Josey, thereby conveying all his undivided right, title and interest in and to the lands described above in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Twenty Five (\$125.00) Dollars, as in said deed named, which said consideration the Court finds is adequate and which deed has been exhibited to this court.

IT IS, THEREFORE, by the Court considered, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said deced above described, be and the same is hereby approved according to Section 9, of an Act of Congress approved May 27, 1908, entitled, "An Act for the removal of Restrictions from a part of the lands of the Five Civilized Tribes; and for other purposes."
