And said party of the second part doth hereby accept the trust created and in him reposed by these presents, and doth for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators hereby covenant and agree to and with the said parties of the second part, their executors administrators and assigns, that he, the said party of the second part, will honestly and faithfully, and without delay, execute the same according to the best of his skill knowledge and ability.
