WHEREAS, the said commission has awarded the real estate described hereinbelow to George L. Cook, who has paid Nineteen & no/100 (\$19.00) Dollars, the full amount of the purchase price, in to the Treasury of the United States, to the credit of the Muskogee or Creek Nation of Indians, with the United States Indian Agent, at Muskogee Indian Territory, and is, therefore, entitled to a patent:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation do by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of Congress of the United States, hereby grant, sell and convey unto said George L. Cook, heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title and interest of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation aforesaid, in and to Lot numbered 4, in Block Numbered 11, in the Town of Red Fork, Muskogee (Creek) Nation, Indian Territory, and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said Nation to be affixed at the date hereinafter shown. Date December 26th, 1905.
