NOW, THEREFORE, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation do,, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid act of Gongress of the United States, hereby grant, sell and convey unto said Fred E. Champion, heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title and interest of the Muskogee (Greek) Nation, aforesaid, in and to Lot Numbered 2, in Block Numbered 11, in the Town of Red Fork, Muskogee (Creek) Nation, Indian Territory and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

IN WITNESS WEREOF, I, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the great Seal of said Nation to be affixed at the date hereinafter shown. Date Becember 26th, 1905.
