 Lester, of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred
 and Thirty-\$20 - - - - and - - - - DOLLARS,
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of
 the second part, her heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of

Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:
 all of Lots seven (7), and eight (8) in
 Block nineteen (19) of the west town
 addition to the city of Tulsa Oklahoma
 according to the recorded plat thereof

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances
 thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.
 In witness whereof, John O. Mitchell and Alice M. Mitchell
 his wife, for their heirs, executors or administrators, do here covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second
 part, that at the delivery of these presents, they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute
 and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises
 with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles,
 charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever, except that
 this warranty shall extend only to title to land, and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part, her heirs and
 assigns, against said party of the first part — their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to
 claim the same.
