This Indenture, Made this First day of October A. D. 1909
 between George T. Kilcoyne and Julia A. Kilcoyne
 his wife
 Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and T. H. Wilder et al
 of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand
Five Hundred and Fifty and 1/2 DOLLARS,

the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of
 the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa

and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

all that part of lot three (3) in Block thirty-
 three (33) having a frontage of seventy-five (75)
 feet on Elwood Avenue, a depth of one
 hundred and forty (140) feet totally, and
 adjoining Second Street (now Brody Street)
 with a uniform width of seventy-five (75)
 feet, and situate in the original boundary
 of Tulsa Indian Territory now Oklahoma
 as shown by the U.S. survey and plat of said
 townsite.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances
 thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said George T. Kilcoyne and Julia A. Kilcoyne
his wife for themselves and their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second
 part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute
 and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises
 with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles,
 charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever, hereby assuming
and agreeing to pay taxes and assessments for the
years 1908 and all subsequent years and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and
 assigns, against said parties of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to
 claim the same.
