This Indenture, Made this 4th day of October A. D. 1909  
 between Joseph P. Harter and Mary O. Harter, his wife  
 Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and  
 Alice Tuel and Mary Tuel as tenants in  
 common, of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
 Fifteen hundred and fifty (\$1650.) and Two DOLLARS,  
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said parties of  
 the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of

Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:  
 Lot five (5) in J. P. Harter's Sub-division of the northwest  
 quarter of section seventeen, township nineteen (19) north, range  
 thirteen (13) east containing 10 acres, according to  
 Recorded plat thereof.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances  
 thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said Joseph P. Harter and Mary O. Harter  
 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do here covenant, promise and agree to and with said parties of the second  
 part, that at the delivery of these presents shall lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute  
 and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises  
 with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles,  
 charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever;  
 including taxes of 1909  
 and that fully will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said parties of the second part their heirs and  
 assigns, against said parties of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to  
 claim the same.
