Albert L. Cunningham of the second part.WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Thousand and other  
valuable considerations (3,000) and — DOLLARS,  
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of  
the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County ofTulsa and State of Oklahoma, to wit:  
Lot six (6) Block six (6) in "Factory Addition" to the City of Tulsa  
Oklahoma, as shown by the record thereof recorded in the office of the  
Register of Deeds and for Tulsa County, Oklahoma, together with all the  
improvements thereon and the appurtenances thereto belonging and  
warrant the title to the same.This deed is given subject to a first mortgage in  
favor of Ervin Clegg in the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars payable as  
follows: Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars due October 30th 1909 and twenty-five  
(\$25.00) dollars due April 30th 1910, both notes bearing 6% interest from date.To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances  
thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.And said W. T. Biddison and Lydia S. Biddison  
for their heirs, executors or administrators, do here covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second

with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles,

assigns, against said parties of the first part — their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to
