This Indenture, Made this 16th day of November A.D. 1919
 between George T. Williamson and Mary Lynn Williamson, his wife
 Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of
Two thousand four hundred and no DOLLARS,
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa
 City of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:
 The northeasterly five feet (7.5) of lot one (1) in Block one
 hundred and fifty-four (154) according to the official plat thereof

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said George T. Williamson and Mary Lynn Williamson, his wife for themselves
 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do here covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever;

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part their heirs and assigns, against said party of the first part — their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
