This Indenture, Made this tenth day of September A.D. 1919
between John P. Skinner and Ladie Skinner his wife

of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and

J. E. Moffett, Trustee
of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, of the second part.

WITNESSETH. The said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of

\$25 and 50 DOLLARS,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of

Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:
The east half of the northeast quarter of section twenty-seven (27) tract number sixteen (16) north of range thirteen (13) east and an undivided one-half interest in the east half of the northwest quarter of section thirteen (13) tract number nineteen (19) north of range twelve (12) east of the Indian Baseline and Meridian line.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining forever.

And said John P. Skinner and Ladie Skinner, husband and wife
for their heirs, executors or administrators, do here covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, to and in all and singular the above granted and described premises with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever;

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part their heirs and assigns, against said party of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or so claiming the same.
