This Indenture, Made this 6th day of December A.D. 1909

WITNESSETH, The said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
Two thousand one hundred and seventy five (\$2,175.00) and no cents DOLLARS,  
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, doth by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of  
 the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of

Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to wit:

The west and half (W<sup>1/2</sup>) of the northwest and quarter (W<sup>1/4</sup>) of section ten (10) township twenty one (21) north range thirteen (13) east of the Indian Base and Meridian

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances  
 thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said Dora Wright  
 for her heirs, executors or administrators, doth here covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second  
 part, that at the delivery of these presents she will lawfully seized in own right of an absolute  
 and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises  
 with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles,  
 charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever, excepting of certain  
 oil and gas lease liability, to W. J. Mitchell, for the sum of \$100.00, and that she will lawfully transfer and release all her rights, title  
 and interest in and to said land to said second party, and second party will fully accept the same,  
 and that she will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and  
 assigns, against said party of the first part, her heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to  
 claim the same.
