This Indenture, Made this 5<sup>th</sup> day of January A. D. 1910  
 between Mesmer Grayson and Joe Grayson her husband  
Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and  
H. C. Rhode of Tulsa, Oklahoma of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said partie of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
 wherof Eight Hundred (\$800.00) and no DOLLARS,  
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said partie of  
 the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa  
 and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

 west  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 35, Township 18 N. Range 13 E. Tulsa  
 County, Oklahoma and the Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northwest  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  and the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  section 35, Township  
 18 N. Range 13 E. Tulsa County, Oklahoma containing 160  
 acres more or less.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances  
 thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said Mesmer Grayson and Joe Grayson her husband  
 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do here covenant, promise and agree to and with said partie of the second  
 part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute
