

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED.

This Indenture, Made and entered into this 29th day of November, one thousand nine hundred and five, by and between Kedusha Bishop also known as Kedusha Penman a single man and Joseph N. Allen and Harry G. Davis of Clarksville, S.S., party of the first part, and

Mrs. Sages, 2.1 parties of the second part,
WITNESSETH: That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of

Eight hundred (\$800.00) Dollars, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto said parties of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situated in the Penman Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory to-wit:

An undivided one half interest in the East Half of the South West quarter and the South West quarter of the South West quarter of Section thirty five (35), and the North West quarter of the North East quarter of Section thirty two (32), Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Twelve (12) East.

together with all the improvements thereon and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same.

And I, Kedusha Bishop, wife the said

Kedusha Bishop, for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.

To have and to hold the said lands unto the said parties of the second part their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
