GENERAL WARRANTY DEED.

This Indenture, Made and entered into this 7th day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six, by and between Johnson Butterfield and Mary L. Butterfield of Collinsville, I.T., parties of the first part, and Alonso M. Cantrey of Collinsville, I.T. party of the second part,

WITNESSETH: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred & Seventy five Dollars, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Cherokee Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory to-wit:

all of Lot six (6) in Block seventy five (75) situated in the town of Collinsville, I.T.

together with all the improvements thereon and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same.

And I, Mary L. Butterfield, wife of the said Johnson Butterfield, for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.

To have and to hold the said lands unto the said party of the second part his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
