

Allotment Deed No. 12041 Deed and Cherokee Patents. Cherokee Citizen Roll No. 28850

COMPARED

THE CHEROKEE NATION, Oklahoma, Formerly Indian Territory.

On All to Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, By the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat. 716), ratified by the Cherokee Nation, August 7, 1902, it is provided that there shall be allotted by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, to each citizen of the Cherokee Tribe, land equal in value to one hundred and ten acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation; and

WHEREAS, It was provided by said Act of Congress that each citizen shall designate, or have designated and selected for him, at the time of his selection of allotment, out of his allotment, as a homestead, land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, for which he shall receive a separate certificate; and

WHEREAS, The said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Arthur L. Adair a citizen of said Tribe, as an allotment, exclusive of land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, selected as a homestead as aforesaid;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the undersigned, Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Arthur L. Adair

all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following-described land, viz.:

The southeast quarter of the northeast quarter and the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter Res 14/100 (141) acre occupied as right of way by the Kansas Oklahoma Central and Southwestern Railway of section twenty four (24) township twenty one (21) north and Range thirteen (13) East, and the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter, and the East half of the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section thirty four (34) township twenty three (23) north and Range twenty four (24) East

of the Indian Base and Meridian in Oklahoma—Indian Territory, containing

seventy nine and 86/100 (79.86)

acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof; subject, however, to all the provisions of said Act of Congress.

On All to Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, The said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of John R. H. Dougherty a citizen of said Tribe, as an allotment, exclusive of land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, selected as a homestead as aforesaid;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the undersigned, Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said John R. H. Dougherty

all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following-described land, viz.:

The southwest quarter of the southeast quarter and the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section twenty eight (28) township twenty (20) north and Range fourteen (14) East,

of the Indian Base and Meridian in Oklahoma—Indian Territory, containing

acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof; subject, however, to all the provisions of said Act of Congress.
