THE CHEROKEE NATION, Oklahoma, Formerly Indian Territory.

To All to Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, By the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat., 716), ratified by the Cherokee Nation, August 7, 1902, it was provided that there should be allotted by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, to each citizen of the Cherokee Nation, land equal in value to one hundred and ten acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation; and,

WHEREAS, It was provided by said Act of Congress that each member of said tribe shall, at the time of the selection of his allotment, designate, or have selected and designated for him, from his allotment, land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, as a homestead, for which separate certificate shall issue; and,

WHEREAS, The said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Owen L. Allen a citizen of said tribe, as a homestead;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Owen L. Allen

all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following-described land, viz.:

The south half of the northwest quarter of the north east quarter, less two and 41/100 (2.41) acres occupied as right of way by the Kansas, Oklahoma Central and Southwestern Railway, and the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter, less one and 75/100 (1.75) acres occupied as right of way by the Kansas, Oklahoma Central and Southwestern Railway of Section Twenty Four (24) Township Twenty One (21) North and Range Thirteen (13) East

of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Oklahoma—Indian Territory, containing

Twenty Nine and 84/100 (25.84) acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof; subject, however, to the conditions provided by said Act of Congress pertaining to allotted homesteads.

THE CHEROKEE NATION, Oklahoma, Formerly Indian Territory.

To All to Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, By the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat., 716), ratified by the Cherokee Nation, August 7, 1902, it was provided that there should be allotted by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, to each citizen of the Cherokee Nation, land equal in value to one hundred and ten acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation; and,

WHEREAS, It was provided by said Act of Congress that each member of said tribe shall, at the time of the selection of his allotment, designate, or have selected and designated for him, from his allotment, land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, as a homestead, for which separate certificate shall issue; and,

WHEREAS, The said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Fellie C. Chase a citizen of said tribe, as a homestead;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Fellie C. Chase

all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following-described land, viz.:

The east half of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of the town Twenty Nine (29) and the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section Twenty Eight (28) Township Twenty One (21) North and Range Thirteen (13) East

of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Oklahoma—Indian Territory, containing

Twenty Three and 30/100 (23.30) acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof; subject, however, to the conditions provided by said Act of Congress pertaining to allotted homesteads.
