The North half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 4, and the North half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 15, Township 19 North, Range 13 East, containing One Hundred Sixty (160) acres.

That on the \_\_\_ day of May 1903, the said Sunday Grayson died and left surviving him as his sole heirs, Buck Grayson, a brother, Wattie Grayson, a brother, Jamie Grayson, a sister and Susie Rife (nee Grayson) a sister, and the said Dick Grayson a brother, that each of the above named heirs were the owners in fee simple of an undivided one-fifth (1/5) interest in said proper-
