

made February 14, 1833, recorded in Volume 4 of Records of Indian needs in the office of Indian Affairs at Washington, D. C., at pages 446 and 447, Grants to Muskogee (Creek) Nation lands, embraced within the following boundaries, viz: Beginning at the mouth of the North Fork of the Canadian River and run northerly four miles; thence running a straight line so as to meet a line drawn from the south bank of the Arkansas River, apposite to the east or lower bank of the Grand River at its junction with the Arkansas and which runs a course south 44 degrees west one mile to a post placed in the ground; thence along said line to the Arkansas and up the same to the Verdigris River to where the old Territorial line crosses it; thence along said line north to a point twenty-five miles from the Arkansas where the old Territorial line crosses the same; thence running at right angles with the Territorial line aforesaid or west to the Mexico line; thence along said line southerly to the Canadian River or to the boundary of the Choctaw Country; thence down said river to place of beginning.

ACT OF CONGRESS, signed by the President of the United States, April 12, 1904, provides for removal of restrictions upon the surplus lands of all allottees of either of the five civilized Tribes, who are not of Indian blood

ACT OF CONGRESS to provide for the final disposition of the affairs of the Five Civilized Tribes provides (among other things) that the adult heirs of any deceased Indian of either of the five civilized Tribes whose selection has been made or to whom a patent has been issued for his or her share of the land of the tribe to which he or she belongs or belonged, may sell and convey the lands inherited from such descendant.

THE NAME OF ANNIE MARTIN, the grantee in the patents shown at numbers 1 and 2 of this abstract, appears upon the Freedman Rolls in the office of the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes at Muskogee, I. T. as No. 1286.

Porter, Principal Chief, to Annie Martin, Homestead Deed, dated October 6, 1902, approved by Thomas Ryan, Acting Secretary of Interior, December 19, 1902. recorded in Book C, page 332 in office of the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes at Muskogee I. T.: Southeast quarter of Northwest quarter of Section 14, Township 19, North Range 12 East.

3. Annie Martin to James M. Guffey, and John H. Galey, Oil and Gas lease, dated April 3, 1903, filed April 12, 1903, recorded in Book G, page 5, in office of Clerk of U. S. Court and ex-officio Recorder for the Eighth Rec. District at Sulphur. (Among other lands) the East one-half of the Northwest quarter of Section 14, Township 19, North, Range 12, East.
