refining and removing such oil and natural gas, including also the right to obtain from wells or other sources on said land, by means of pipe lines or otherwise, a s fficient supply of water to carry on said operations, and including still further the right to use such oil and natur al gas as fuel so far as it is necessary to the prosecution of said operations

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In consideration of which the party of the second part hereby agrees an binds itself its successors and assigns to pay or cause to be paid to the United States Indian Agent, Union Agency, Indian Territory for the lessor, as royalty the sum of (10 per cent of the gross proceedson the leased premises, of all crude oil extracted from the said land, such pay ... nt .. bmade at the time of sale or disposition of the oil and the lessee shall pay on each producing well utilized, where the capacity is tested at three million cabic feet or less per day of twenty-four hours, one hum dred and fifty dollars per annum and where the capacity is more than three million could feet per day fifty dollars for each additional million cubic f it or fraction thereof. The leggor shall have the free use of gas for lighting and warming his residence on the premises. It is further agreed that a failure on the part of the lessee to use a gasproducing well, where the same can not be reasonably utilized at the rate so prescribed, shall not work a forfetture of this lease so far as the same relates to mining oil, but if the lesser desires to retain gas-producing privilenes it shall pay a royalty of fifty dollars per annum, in advance on each gas-producing well not utilized, the first payment to recome due and to be made within thrity days from the date of the discovery of Fas.

And the party of the second part further agrees and binds itself its succe.sors and assigns to pay or cause to be paid to the said agent, for lessor as advance annual royalty on this lease, the sums of money as follows to-wit: Eifteencents per acre per annum in advance for the first and second years; Thirty cents per acre per annum in advance for the third and fourth years and Seventy-five cents per acre, per annum in advance for the fifth and each successding year thereafter of the termfor which this lease is to run; it being understood and agreed that said sums of money so paid shall be a credit on the stipulated royalties and further that should the party of the second part neglect or refuse to pay such advance annual r yalty for the period of sixty days after the same becomes due and payable the Secretary of the Interior after ten day's notice to the the parties may declare this lease null and void and all royalties paid in advance shall becomes the money and property of the lessor. whe party of the second part further covenants and agrees to exercise

diligence in the sinking of wells for oil and natural gas on the lands covered by this lease, and to drill at lease one well thereon within twelve months from the date of the approval of the bond by theSecretary of the Interior, and should the party of the second part fail , neglect or refuse

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
