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OIL LEASE.

In consideration of the sum of Two (\$2.00) Dollars, the receipt of which is acknowledged by the first party C. M. Virtis of Mohawk, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, first part does hereby grant and convey unto Frank Hackathorn & T. F. Soles of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma second parties all the oil and gas, in and under the premises hereinafter described, together with said premises for the purpose and with the exclusive right to enter thereon at all times by their self, agents and employees, to drill and operate wells for oil, gas and water, and to erect, maintain, occupy, repair and remove all buildings, telephone poles and wires, structures, pipelines, machinery and appliances that second parties may deem necessary, convenient or expedient to the production of oil, gas and water, thereon, and the transportation of oil, gas and water, on, upon and over said premises and the highways along the same, except, that first party shall have the full one-eighth part of all oil produced and saved on the premises, and first party agrees to accept said share of said oil, as full compensation for all products of each well in which oil is found.
