RELEASE OF OKLAHOMA MORTGAGE.

WHEREAS, on the 10th day of January 1906, Chris C. Megee and Sarah A. Megee, his wife, by their certain mortgage recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds at Tulsa, Oklahoma on January 13th 1906, in Record Eight (8) Page Thirty two (32) conveyed to the Dickason Goodman Lumber Company, a corporation, real estate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The east half (1/2) of Lot two (2) in Block Two (2) according to the government survey of the original town of Tulsa, Indian Territory, in trust to secure the payment of a certain promissory note dated January 13th, 1906, amounting to Eight Hundred and forty (\$840.00) dollars, all in said mortgage fully described.

And whereas, said Chris C. Megee and Sarah A. Megee, his wife, have fully discharged said mortgage and are entitled to release of said mortgage; therefore, in consideration of the payment of said indebtedness, said Dickason Goodman Lumber Company, a corporation, does hereby release and quit-claim above described real estate and every part thereof to said Chris C. Megee and Sarah A. Megee, his wife, and their heirs and assigns, and does hereby satisfy, discharge and cancel said mortgage and the lien and effect thereof.

In witness whereof, the said Dickason Goodman Lumber Company has caused this instrument to be signed by its Vice President in the absence of its President, attested by its Secretary and its corporate seal hereto affixed this 11th day of January 1910.
