PATENT.

THE CHEROKEE NATION, INDIAN TERRITORY.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME PERTAINING:

WHEREAS, a townsite commission, heretofore appointed under the Act of Congress approved May 31, 1900 (31 Stat. 221) and acting under authority of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat. 716) ratified by the Cherokee Nation August 7, 1902, has appraised the lots in the town of Owasso, Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, and

WHEREAS, the plat of said town was approved by the Secretary of the Interior on the 26th day of March 1904 and was duly placed on file; and

WHEREAS, said commission has appraised all of the town lots included in said plat at their true value, excluding improvements, which appraisal has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; and

WHEREAS, the said commission has awarded the real estate described hereinbelow to Town of Owasso who has paid Forty (\$40.00) dollars the full amount of the purchase price, into the treasury of the United States, to the credit of the Cherokee Nation of Indians, with the United States Indian Agent, at Muskogee, Indian Territory, and is, therefore, entitled to a patent:

Now, Therefore, I, the undersigned the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, hereby grant, sell, and convey unto the said Town of Owasso its successors and assigns forever, all the right, title, and interest of the Cherokee Nation, aforesaid, in and to the CEMETERY more fully described as follows: The S 1/2 of the S.W. 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 14 East, containing 5 acres near the town of Owasso, Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.
