ORDER APPROVING DEED.

COMPARED

Now on this the 20th day of January, 1910, came on for hearing the petition of Menena Grayson, the sole heir at law of Salina Gray, deceased, said petitioner appearing in person and by her attorney, J.S. Severson, and after hearing the testimony and the argument of counsel the court being fully advised in the premises finds:

That Salina Gray was a full blood Creek Indian and so appears on the Creek Rolls, Union Agency, at Muskogee, Oklahoma, and by reason thereof there was allotted to her the following land situate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit: The North $\frac{1}{2}$ of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, Township 18 North, Range 13 East, and the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ and the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 35, Township 18 North Range 13 East, containing 160 acres more or less.

The court further finds that the said Salina Gray departed this life on the----day of March, 1900, in what is now McIntosh County, in the state of Oklahoma, intestate, at the tender age of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ years of age leaving as her sole heir at law her mother, Menena Grayson, the petitioner herein, and that the petitioner is a full Creek Indian of legal age.

The court further finds that the petitioner herein did on the 5th day of January 1910, make and execute to W.E. Rohde, a general warranty deed to said land, jointly with her husband Joe Grayson, conveying said land to said W.E. Rohde, for the consideration of \$800.00.

The court further finds the consideration of \$800.00 for the land described in said deed is adequate, and that the same has been paid in cash to petitioner herein as the legal representative of said deceased allottee.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the court that the
