

A parcel of land, being a portion of the right of way of the Dawson Spur or Branch of the St Louis and San Francisco Railroad Company, located and constructed upon and across lot three (3) of section three (3) Township nineteen (19) north, range thirteen (13) east, in the Cherokee Nation, Oklahoma, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of section three (3) township nineteen (19) north, range thirteen (13) east, thence running north along the east line of said northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of said section three (3) a distance of seven hundred and twenty five (725) feet, to the dividing line between the Creek and Cherokee nations; thence running west along said dividing line a distance of two hundred and ninety five (295) feet to the center of the track of said Dawson Spur or Branch, for a point of beginning;

Thence running west continuing along said last mentioned course, a distance of fifty and two-tenths (50.2) feet; thence running northerly and making an angle of ninety four (94) degrees and twenty eight (28) minutes with the last described course, parallel to and fifty (50) feet perpendicularly distant in a westerly direction from the center line of said track a distance of six hundred and seventy seven (677) feet, more or less, to the north line of said section three (3) thence running east along the north line of said section three (3) a distance of one hundred and four tenths (100.4) feet; thence running southerly and making an angle of ninety four (94) degrees and twenty eight (28) minutes with the last described course, parallel to and fifty (50) feet perpendicularly distant in an easterly direction from the center line of said track, a distance of six hundred and seventy seven (677) feet, more or less, to the dividing line between the Creek and Cherokee Nations; thence west along said dividing line a distance of fifty and two tenths (50.2) feet to the point of beginning, containing One and fifty five hundredths (1.55) acres, more or less, of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, as the case may be according to the United States Survey thereof, subject, however, to the provisions of the act of Congress approved April 26, 1906, (34 Stat. 1,137)
