

That said Pete Littleton was a citizen by blood of the Cherokee Nation or Tribe of Indians, and duly enrolled as such by the Commission to The Five Civilized Tribes, his name appearing upon the approved roll of citizens of said Nation opposite number 30174.

That there was allotted to said Pete Littleton as his share of the lands of the Cherokee Nation, the following described premises, to-wit:

The west one-half of the Southwest Quarter of Section Twelve, (12), in Township Twenty one (21) North of range Twelve (12) east, in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and that he was the absolute owner thereof at the date of his death.

That at the time of his death said Pete Littleton left him surviving, as his widow, said Matilda Littleton, and as his children and sole heirs at law, his daughters Ida Littleton, aged four years, and May Littleton, aged one year.

That since the death of said Pete Littleton, to-wit, on the 6th day of February, 1910, said May Littleton, daughter and heir at law of said Pete Littleton, as aforesaid, died intestate, single, unmarried, and without issue, at her residence in Tulsa County Oklahoma, and leaving her surviving as her sole and only heir at law, her mother, the said Matilda Littleton.

That said Matilda Littleton is the owner by inheritance from her deceased husband and daughter aforesaid, of an undivided two-thirds interest in and to said described real estate.

That said Matilda Littleton is a full blood Indian.

That she has sold her undivided two-thirds interest as aforesaid to W.O. Dickenson, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, for the sum of Six Hundred Dollars, and has executed a general warranty deed therefor to said Dickenson under date of February 14, 1910, and that she has received the full amount of said consideration in cash, and that said sum is the fair and reasonable value of her interest in said land, and that said deed should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED ORDERED AND ADJUDGED BY THE COURT, that said deed so executed by said Matilda Littleton to said W.O. Dickenson, bearing date of February 14, 1910, be and the same is in all things approved and confirmed, subject to payment of debts and costs of administration of estate of Pete Littleton, deceased.
