

Third, and it further appearing that said George W. Morey is of the sound mind and fully able to transact his own affairs and that his interests will be greatly and materially promoted by conferring the rights of majority upon him at this time.

Fourth, and it further appearing that notice of the petition and application for the rights of majority was given before the filing of the petition in this cause as required by law, by publication of a notice thereof in the Indian Journal, a weekly newspaper printed in McIntosh County, Oklahoma, and generally circulated ^{therein} for two consecutive weeks prior to the filing of this petition, that a copy of said notice together with the affidavit of the editor and publisher is attached to the petition in this cause and marked "Exhibit" A and made a part of this petition, and it further appearing that said minor offers to pay the cost of this proceeding.

Now, therefore, it is ordered, adjudged and decreed that the rights of majority concerning contracts and deeds be and the same are hereby conferred upon the said George W. Morey, and that he is authorized and empowered to transact business in general and particular to-wit: To enter into all kinds of contracts affecting both his real and personal property, and to bring suit to enforce any such contracts, and to execute any and all necessary deeds and leases in conveying any of his real property or any interest therein, and to conduct and control all of his business involving his estate both real and personal with the same force and effect as if such acts and things were done or performed by a person above the age of 21 years.
