LEASE  
TRANSFERABLE ONLY WITH CONSENT OF THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR

OIL AND GAS MINING LEASE UPON LAND SELECTED BY ALLOTMENT CHEROKEE NATION  
INDIAN TERRITORY.

THIS INDENTURE OF LEASE, Made and entered into in quadruplicate on this 12th day of August, A.D. 1907, by and between Mollie Key of Cookson, I.T. party of the first part, lessor and Duquense Oil and Gas Company of Bartlesville, I.T. and Pittsburg, Pa. party of the second part, lessee, under and in pursuance of the provisions of sections 19 and 20 of the act of Congress approved April 26, 1906, and the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior thereunder.

WITNESSETH, that the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the royalties, covenants, stipulations, and conditions hereinafter contained, and hereby agreed to be paid, observed, and performed by the party of the second part, its heirs, successors and assigns, does hereby demise, grant, and let unto the party of the second part, its heirs, successors, and assigns, for the term of fifteen (15) years from the date hereof, all of oil deposits and natural gas in or under the following described tract of land, lying and being within the Cherokee Indian Nation and within the Indian Territory, to-wit: The SW 1/4 of SW 1/4 and S 1/2 of NW 1/4 of SW 1/4 of section 36, township 22 N. range 13 E. of the Indian Meridian and containing 60 acres, more or less, with the right to prospect for, extract pipe store, refine, and remove such oil and natural gas, and to occupy and use so much only of the surface of said land as may be reasonable necessary to carry on the work of prospecting for, extracting, storing, and removing such oil and natural gas, including also the right to obtain from wells or other sources on said land, by means of pipe lines or otherwise, a sufficient supply of water to carry on said operations, and including still
