Beginning at a point 86 feet and 9 inches east of the Northwest corner of the Northwest quarter (NW4) of the Southwest quarter (SW4) of the Southwest quarter (SW4) of Section Thirteen (13) Township Twenty one (21) North, range Twelve (12) east of the Indian Base and Meridian, thence east 270 feet; thence south 300 feet; thence west 170 feet to the right of way of the Midland Valley Railroad; thence north and west along said right of way 317 feet to the place of beginning, containing 1.52 acres, more or less, located in Tulsa county,
