Ingram, Mattie Williams, Charley Houston, The Kansas Petroleum Development Company, and the Cherokee Nation or Tribe of Indians, Roy B. Ingram, Georgia Lee Ingram, Waunita Ingram, and William Swindle, and to all persons interested by reason of the appropriation and condemnation of land sought to be appropriated in the above entitled proceedings by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company as successor in interest by judicial sale of the Kansas Oklahoma Central and Southwestern Railway Company for right of way and other railroad purposes, on the line of its amended definite location, between Owasso in the Cherokee Nation and Tulsa in the Creek Nation in said Indian Territory, respectfully report that before entering upon the duties of our appointment we each took and subscribed before a competent authority an oath that we would faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of our appointment, which oaths duly certified are returned herewith, that before proceeding to the appraisal of compensation and damages to be paid by reason of the appropriation of the lands hereinafter described, we caused ten days personal notice to be served on John Ingram, Lizzie Adair, Frank E. Gray, Charles Lancaster, Mattie Williams, William Swindle and the Cherokee Nation or Tribe of Indians, Anna L. Ingram, Rachel Hider, Theodore Parris, John M. Ingram, Roy B. Ingram, Georgia Lee Ingram and Waunita Ingram and on J.H. Huckleberry, guardian ad litem by appointment of the Judge of said Court for Anna L. Ingram, Rachel Hider, Theodore Parris, Flossie Parris, George Horne, John M. Ingram, Roy B. Ingram, Georgia Lee Ingram, and Waunita Ingram, minors, and twenty days notice to all of the defendants herein named and to all other persons having or
