The Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING:

WHEREAS, a townsite commission, heretofore appointed under the Act of Congress approved May 31, 1900 (31 Stats 221) and acting under authority of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, (32 Stats 716) ratified by the Cherokee Nation August 7, 1902, has appraised the lots in the town of Owasso, Okla, formerly Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory; and

Whereas, the plat of said town was approved by the secretary of the Interior on the 26th day of March 1904, and was duly placed on file; and

Whereas, said commission has appraised all of the town lots included in said plat at their true value, excluding improvements, which appraisal has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior, and

WHEREAS, the said commission has awarded the real estate described hereinbelow to Abraham Carlin who has paid seventy dollars, the full amount of the purchase price into the treasury of the United States, to the credit of the Cherokee Nation of Indians with the United States Indian Agent at Muskogee, Indian Territory, and is, therefore entitled to a patent:

Now, Therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, hereby grant, sell and convey unto the said Abraham Carlin his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, aforesaid in and to Lot numbered 1 in Block numbered 23, in the town of Owasso, Okla. formerly Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.
