AWARD OF REFEREES

TO THE CLERK OF THE UNITED STATES COURT FOR THE INDIAN TERRITORY NORTHERN DISTRICT.

We, the undersigned, heretofore appointed by the Honorable Joseph A. Gill, Judge of the United States Court for the Indian Territory, Northern District, (to appraise the compensation and damages to be paid to the above named defendants and to all persons interested by reason of the appropriation and condemnation of land sought to be appropriated by The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company as successor in interest by judicial sale of the Kansas Oklahoma Central and Southwestern Railway Company, for right of way and other railroad purposes, on the line of its amended definite location between Owasso in the Cherokee Nation and Tulsa in the Creek Nation in said Indian Territory respectfully report that before entering upon the duties of our appointment we each took and subscribed before a competent authority an oath that we would faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of our appointment which oaths duly certified are returned herewith. That before proceeding to the appraisal of compensation and damage to be paid by reason of the appropriation of the lands hereinafter described, we caused ten days personal notice to be served on each of the defendants above named, and on George Bullette, Guardian ad litem by appointment of the judge of said court for Georgia P. Bullette, John E. Bullette, Nellie F. Bullette, and Jessie Bullette, minors, and on George Bullette, legal guardian for Dalton Beaver, a minor, and twenty days notice to the said defendants and to all other persons having or claiming to have an interest in the land hereinafter described, by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in said district nearest to the said land, that we would ^{meet} on the 20th day of February A.D. 1905, at 9 o'clock A.M. at the depot of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, in the Town of Owasso in said Cherokee Nation Indian Territory and proceed from thence to inspect said real property and assess the compensation and damages to be paid by reason of the appropriation and condemnation of the land hereinafter described for right of way and other railroad purposes.

We further report that on the 20th day of February A.D. 1905, at 9 o'clock A.M. the undersigned referees met at the time and place appointed in said notices and that the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company appeared by J.B. Furry, its attorney; that the said defendants, Georgia P. Bullette, John E. Bullette, Nellie F. Bullette and Jessie Bullette appeared by George Bullette, their duly appointed Guardian ad litem in this
