## GENERAL WARRANTY DEED.

COMPARED

THIS INDENTURE, Made this Twelfth day of November A.D. 1907, between James D. Capron, Junior, a single man of the City of St. Louis, in the State of Missouri, party of the first part, and G.H. Smith, of Hannibal, Missouri, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH, the said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Fifty No/100 Dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all the following described real estate, situated in the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Eight (8) in Block Thirty five (35) of West Tulsa, Addition, a subdivision of the east half of the northwest quarter of Section fourteen, Township nineteen north, range twelve east, according to the amended plat thereof, recorded in the office of the Deputy Clerk of the United States Court, and Ex officio Recorder of Tulsa, Indian Territory, in Book 2 at page 639.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said party of the first part for himself, his heirs, executors, or administrators, does hereby covenant, to and with said party of the second part, that he will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, against all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming the same.
