ORDER APPROVING DEED.

This matter coming on to be heard on this the 28th day of February, 1910, upon the petition of Eli Bell and his wife Silby Bell, praying for an order of this Court, approving a certain deed by them made executed and delivered, conveying their interest in the below described lands, the same being part of the allotment of Cilla Bell deceased.

Said petitioners appearing in person, and by their attorneys, Ramsdale & Brown, and the Court after hearing the testimony of the petitioners and disinterested witnesses, and the argument of Counsel, and being fully advised in the premises doth find that all the allegations contained in the said petition are true.

That the said petitioners are full blood creek Indians, duly enrolled as such: That the deceased, Cilla Bell, was a full blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such, and that by reason thereof, the same was allotted to her, as part of her distributive share of the lands of the Creek Nation, the following described property, the same being situated in what is now Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:-

The South West Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section Nine (9),
Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, con-
taining Forty (40) acres more or less.

The Court further finds that the said Cilla Bell, died on the 5th day of February, 1910, intestate. *That the said Cilla Bell was unmarried and left surviving her no issue.* That the said Cilla Bell died in what is now the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, and left surviving her as her only heirs at
