

the petition of Eli Bell and his wife Silby Bell, praying for an order of this Court approving a certain deed by them made executed and delivered, covering their interest in the below described lands, and same being part of the allotment of Silla Bell, deceased.

Said petitioners appearing in person and by their attorneys, Ramsdale & Brown, and the Court after hearing the testimony of the petitioners and disinterested witnesses, and the argument of counsel and being fully advised in the premises, doth find that all the allegations contained in the said petition are true.

That the said petitioners are full blood Creek Indians, duly enrolled as such; that the deceased Silla Bell, was a full blood Creek Indian duly enrolled as such, and that by reason thereof there was allotted to her as part of her distributive share of the lands of the Creek Nation, the following described property, the same being situated in what is now Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit :-

The South West Quarter (1/4) of the South West Quarter (1/4) of Section Nine (9) Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Thirteen (13) East containing Forty (40) acres more or less.

The court further finds that the said Silla Bell, died on the fifth day of February 1910 intestate, That the said Silla Bell was unmarried and left surviving her no issue. That the said Silla Bell died in what is now the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, and left surviving her as her only heirs at law her mother and father, Eli Bell and Silby Bell, the petitioners herein named.

The Court further finds, that on the 28th day of February, 1910, the petitioners Eli Bell and Silby Bell made executed and delivered to Ethel Davis a general warranty deed covering the Forty (40) acres above described, for the consideration of \$850.00, which said consideration the Court finds is adequate.

Wherefore it is by the Court considered, ordered, and adjudged that the said deed above described be, and the same is hereby approved, according to to Section 9, of an Act of Congress approved May 27th, 1908, entitled "An Act for the removal of Restrictions from part of the lands of the allottees of the Five Civilized Tribes, and for other purposes."
