Articles of Incorporations of the First Baptist Church of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma.

Know all men by these presents: That we , whose names are hereunto subscribed , do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the laws of the state of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

First: The name of this corporation shall be The First Baptist Church of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma.

Second: the purpose for which this corporation is formed is to acquire and hold such property for church and other religious purposes , as may be necessary fo its membership in religious worship and to conduct such worship and exercises.

Third: The location of this corporation shall be a t Broken Arrow, Oklahoma.

Fourth: The term for which this corporation shall exist shall be perpetual.

Fifth: There shall be three trustees of this corporation; and at an election held at Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, on the 1st day of December 1909, the following named trustees were elected to serve until their successors were chosen: J. B. Prowell, Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, J W. Chilton and M. P. Howser, both of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma.

Sixth: The terms of admission to the said chruch shall be as follows:
