

THE CHEROKEE NATION.  
INDIAN TERRITORY.

COMPARED

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Whereas, a townsite commission; heretofore appointed under the Act of Congress approved May 31, 1900 (31 Stats., 221) and acting under authority of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stats. 716), ratified by the Cherokee Nation August 7, 1902, has appraised the lots in the town of North-Tulsa Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory; and

Whereas, the plat of said town was approved by the Secretary of the Interior on the 16th, day of April, 1904, and was duly placed on file; and

Whereas, said commission has appraised all of the town lots included in said plat at their true value, excluding improvements, which appraisal has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; and

Whereas, the said commission has awarded the real estate described hereinbelow to Mary P. Davis who has paid Seventy Five (\$75.00) dollars, the full amount of the purchase price, into the treasury of the United States to the credit of the Cherokee Nation of Indians, with the United States Indian Agent at Muskogee, Indian Territory, and is, therefore, entitled to a patent;

Now, Therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, hereby grant, sell and convey unto the said Mary P. Davis her heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, aforesaid, in and to Lot numbered South 50 feet 2, all 3, in Block---- numbered 12----in the town of North-Tulsa, Cherokee Nation Indian Territory, and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, Have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said nation to be affixed at the date herein-after shown.
