THE MUSKOGEE (CREEK) NATION INDIAN TERRITORY.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Whereas, a townsite commission, heretofore appointed and acting under the authority of the act of Congress approved, March 1, 1901 (31 Stat. 861) agreement ratified by the Creek Nation May 25, 1901, has appraised the lots in the town of Tulsa, Muskogee (Creek) Nation ^{Indian} Territory and

Whereas, the plat of said town was approved by the Secretary of the Interior on the 11th day of April, 1902, and was duly place on file; and

Whereas, the said commission has appraised all of the town lots included in said plat at their true value, excluding improvements which appraisal has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; and

Whereas, the said commission has awarded the real estate described hereinbelow to John H. Baker, who has paid Seventy-Seven & 40/100 (\$77.40) Dollars the full amount of the purchase price, into the treasury of the United States, to the credit of the Muskogee or Creek nation of Indians, with the United States Indian Agent, at Muskogee Indian Territory, and is, therefore, entitled to a patent;

Now, Therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, hereby grant sell, and convey unto said John H. Baker, heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title and interest of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation aforesaid, in and to Lots Numbered 1, and 6 and 7, and _____ Parts of Lots Numbered 2 and 5, in Block Numbered 7, _____ Described as All of Lots 1 and 6 and 7, in Block 7, an that part of Lot 2, in Block 7, having a frontage of 18 feet on Boston Ave., a depth of 140 feet to an alley and adjoining Lot 1 with a uniform width of 18 feet, and that part of Lot 5, in Block 7, having a frontage of 18 feet on Main Street, a depth of 140 feet to an alley and adjoining Lot 6, with a uniform width of 18 feet. in the Town of Tulsa, Muskogee (Creek) nation Indian Territory and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

In Witness Whereof, I, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said Nation to be affixed at the date hereinafter shown.
