of his proceedings under the said order of sale and duly returned to this Court an account of sale, verified by affidavit of the said Thomas Suwat, and this Court having examined the Said return and having in open Court examined the said Thomas Suwat, and it appearing to the satisfaction of this Court;

That in pursuance of said order of sale, Thomas Suwat caused the time and place of holding said sale to be posted up in three of the most public places in said County, in which the land ordered to be sold is situated, and to be published in the Tulsa Weekly Democrat, a newspaper printed and published in the same County, for three weeks successively next before such sale, in which notice the lands and tenements to be sold were described with common certainty.
