> The Northeast Quarter of section thirteen (13), Township seventeen (17) North of range fourteen (14) east of the Indian Meridian,

leaving as her sole and only heirs at law in whom title to her lands might or could vest, William Fulsom and Taylor Chissoe, her sons, Sallie Chissoe and Dora Chissoe, her daughters and Austin Chissoe, her husband; that your petitioner has sold and conveyed by warranty deed to The August Land Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue on the laws of the Indian Territory, his inherited interest in the above described land for a
