Morris, Emma J. Stutz, Elizabeth F. Dressler, Mary N. Bernard and John W. Morris, were plaintiffs and P. Lydia Morris and Sylvester F. Morris, were defendants the said Sheriff duly advertised, according to law and said decree, the premises hereinafter described for sale at public auction to the highest and best bidder for cash, at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon, on the 27th day of April, 1910, at the front door of the Court House in the City of Tulsa, in said Tulsa County and State of Oklahoma:
