KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That International Land Co., a corporation organized under the laws of the United States formerly in force in Indian Territory, of Muskogee, Oklahoma, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell convey and quitclaim unto Sam Bighead the following described real property and premises situate in Tulsa County State of Oklahoma, to-wit: The North Half of the South East quarter of Section Ten (10) Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Twelve (12) East, To correct error in former deed together with all the improvements thereon and the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

To have and to hold the said described premises unto the said grantee, his heirs and assigns forever.

This indenture made this 30th day of April, 1910 between H.F. Newblock, Sheriff of Tulsa, County, State of Oklahoma, party of the first part, and Archie E. Grimes, party of the second part, witnesseth:

Whereas, in pursuance of a decree entered on the 23rd day of March, 1910, by the District Court of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, in a certain case then pending therein, wherein Harriett W. Morris, Emma J. Stutz, Elizabeth F. Dressler, Mary N. Bernard and John W. Morris, were plaintiffs and P. Lydia Morris and Sylvester F. Morris, were defendants, the said Sheriff duly advertised, according to law and said decree, the premises hereinafter described for sale at Public auction, to the highest and best bidder for cash, at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon on the 27th day of April 1910 at the front door of the Court House in the City of Tulsa, in said Tulsa County and State of Oklahoma;

And, whereas, at the time and place as aforesaid appointed for said sale, the said Sheriff attended to make the same, and offered and exposed said premises for sale at public auction, to the highest and best bidder for cash, and thereupon Archie E.
